Tikanga Maori

- 'straight, direct' moral connotations of justice correct and right
- Implementation of this standard sets precedents that give effect to ground rules (kaupapa)
- Framework gives effect to further concepts
- Mana tapu act as regulators
- Whakapapa
- Legal lens Tikanga is the legal structure that gives effect to basic principles and further concepts regulate the relationships between people, environment and spirtual world
- Aim = balance

Example

- Fishing
- Tikanga ground rules time, place, species
- Regulators
- Mana who would fish Tapu provide restrictions
- Overfishing would cause an imbalance
- Tapu or rahui
- Restore balance

- All knowledge and manifestations of
- Tikanga Maori provides the framework to regulate and protect Matauranga
- Haka
- Rongoa
- Regulators
